# ANNUAL REPORT 2020-2021

## History of the Institute

The inspiring saga of Besant Institutions began in 1918 when Dr. Annie Besant, the renowned social reformer, laid the foundation stone for Besant Primary School at Kodialbail in Mangalore. The school, which was initially managed by the Theosophical Society of India has played host to illustrious personalities like Nobel Laureate Rabindranath Tagore, the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi and the Governor General of India Chakravarti Rajagopalachari.

Women's National Education Society (WNES) took over the school administration from the Theosophical Society in 1943. Since then, the institution has recorded continuous growth under the leadership of its visionary administrators like the late Manel Srinivas Nayak, late B. Damodar Prabhu, late Manel Krishna Nayak and the late Prof. P. P. Gomathi.

Their far-sighted initiatives resulted in the establishment of a string of institutions, namely Besant Higher Primary School (Kannada Medium), National High School (Kannada Medium), Besant English School, Besant National Pre-University College, Besant Women's College and Besant Evening College.

In 1999, WNES spread out its wings to launch its most prestigious academic venture. The MSNM Besant Institute of PG Management Studies was established on a new campus situated at Bondel, in the outskirts of Mangalore. This is today the flagship institution of WNES, being widely recognised as a frontrunner in modern management education.

## Our Patron – Dr. Annie Besant (1847-1933)

The real aim of education must be to make boys and girls good citizens of a free and spiritual commonwealth of humanity. - Dr. Annie Besant



We draw inspiration from our patron, who was a prominent British socialist, Theosophist, women's rights activist, writer and orator and supporter of Irish and Indian self-rule.

In 1890 Besant met Helena Blavatsky and over the next few years she became a member of the Theosophical Society and a prominent speaker on the subject. As part of her theosophy-related work, she travelled to India. In 1898 she helped establish the Central Hindu College and in 1922 the Hyderabad (Sind) National Collegiate Board in Mumbai, India.

In 1902, she established the first overseas Lodge of the International Order of Co-Freemasonry, Le Droit Humain. Over the next few years, she established lodges in many parts of the British Empire.

In 1907 she became president of the Theosophical Society, whose international headquarters were at Adyar, Madras, (Chennai).

She also became involved in politics in India, joining the Indian National Congress. When World War I broke out in 1914, she helped launch the Home Rule League to campaign for democracy in India and dominion status within the Empire. This led to her election as president of the Indian National Congress in late 1917.

After the war, she continued to campaign for Indian independence and for the causes of theosophy, until her death in 1933.

Besant institutions in Mangalore were founded under the auspices of Theosophical Society during her visit to Mangalore in 1918.

Women's National Education Society (WNES) was formed in 1943 to take over management of the rapidly growing institutions from Theosophical Society and enable them to grow as an independent organisation.

## Our Visionary Leader-Manel Srinivas Nayak (1913-1991)



Born on February 8, 1913, into a family with a long tradition of business, philanthropy, and social service Manel Srinivas Nayak joined the freedom movement under the Indian National Congress (INC) in 1930 and served two terms as Member of the Legislative), Mangalore 1 constituency between 1961-69 in the erstwhile Mysore State Legislative Assembly. He served as President of the Kanara Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI) (1958-59) and was also on the board of Directors of Canara Bank (1965-69) in addition to numerous other welfare related endeavours. social Simultaneously, ably assisted by his family he further successfully expanded the family-run hardware business into petroleum retail as well.

Following his retirement from active politics he immersed himself in the working of the Besant Institutions joining the parent Society (WNES) in 1974 and continued as President till 1990. His tenure as President oversaw the founding of Besant Evening College, Besant Women's College and Besant English School. In remembrance of his contributions to the Besant Group of Institutions and education at large, MSNIM was established in 1999 - the first private institute in Mangalore to offer an MBA programme under affiliation to Mangalore University. The institute aims to empower minds, provide a platform for entrepreneurship and at the same time uphold the esteemed values of integrity of character and service to the society.
